**Date:** June 25-26 (Sat/Sun)

**Location:** San Joaquin River between  
False River and Mandeville Island.



### **Events Include:**

- 1) Two races on Saturday and one on Sunday. Separate starts for fleets of five boats. Separate courses for slower boats if numbers warrant it. Awards for all classes.
- 2) Friday evening: Complimentary hot dogs, chips and soda.
- 3) Saturday evening: BBQ Tri-Tip dinner.
- 4) Awards ceremony Sunday afternoon.
- 5) RaceQs replay of all races.

**Registration:** Regatta open to all sailboats 20 feet or longer. Reg fee \$40.

**Awards:** Cruising Class, Racing Class, One designs (for each fleet) and sub-Classes if split into Silver and Gold fleets.

**“FRANK’S TRACT TRACTOR TROPHY” awarded to winning Yacht Club in cruising class.**

**Rules:** Current RRS and NCPHRF ratings will apply except as modified by ACYC in NOR and SI.

**Races:** Five minute start using America's Cup flag system. Marks using channel markers on the river. Course descriptions with chart will be provided.

### **Local Services:**

KOA campground ½ mile from ACYC Clubhouse on the Delta Loop.

Brannan Island State Park is three miles away off of Highway 160 just west of Highway 12.

Launch Ramps are at B&W Resort just off of Highway 12 at the Mokulumne River Bridge and at Brannan Island State Park.

### **Required and Suggested Gear:**

Boats are required to have a marine VHF radio and should have a motor and anchor rode. Charts or chartplotters are not necessary but advisable for navigation around sand bars and in 1-2 knot tides. Winds can be in excess of twenty knots.

Life preservers in accordance with Coast Guard regulations are required and will be worn whenever winds exceed 15 knots (whitecaps form).
